- The Hornets face the Nuggets just three days after the January 6<sup>th</sup> home meeting between the two teams...it will mark the second consecutive season the two teams have met on 1/9 in Denver.
- With a victory in the season finale in 2010-11, the Nuggets drew the all-time series even between the two teams at 29-29...the win also pushed George Karl's all-time record against the Hornets over .500 at 29-28.
- In the first matchup of last season, in his second game in a Hornets uniform, Trevor Ariza had a stellar all-around game with 11 points, 4 rebounds, 4 assists, 4 steals and 1 block.
- In Game 4 vs. DEN in the opening round of the 2009 NBA Playoffs, the Hornets lost 121-63...the 58-point margin marked the worst lost in NBA playoff history, and the worst loss at home in NBA history.
- The Hornets blocked a franchise-record 15 shots and pulled down a franchise-record tying 46 defensive rebounds in regulation against the Nuggets on 12/12/92.
- In the 11/16/05 matchup with Denver, the Hornets attempted a franchise high 13 three-pointers without a make.
- The 143 total points scored between the two teams in Denver on 11/29/04 is tied for the fourth lowest combined point total in a game in Hornets franchise history.
- Monty Williams is 2-2 (.500) all-time against the Nuggets...George Karl is 30-28 (.517) all-time against the Hornets.

### HORNETS-NUGGETS CONNECTIONS

- Nuggets F Chris Andersen played for the Hornets during the '04-'05, '05-'06 and '07-'08 seasons...a total of 104 games.
- Nuggets F Al Harrington was teammates with Hornets G Marco Belinelli for the beginning of the '08-'09 season, before being traded to the Knicks...Belinelli and Nuggets F Danilo Gallinari both hail from Italy.
- Hornets Head Coach Monty Williams appeared in one game for the Nuggets during the '98-'99 season.
- Hornets F Jason Smith is from Kersey, CO and played collegiately at Colorado State University.
- Hornets Director of Athletic Development Carlos Daniel was in training camp with the Nuggets in 1999.

- The 76ers shot 47.7% from the floor en route to 101 points, the first team to score over the century mark against New Orleans this season.
- Carl Landry, (7-8), Eric Gordon (5-6), Jarrett Jack (5-5) and Jason Smith (2-2) combined to shoot 19-21 from the free throw line, as New Orleans shot 80.0% from the line as a team (20-25)...the 76ers missed just three free throws, finishing 15-18 from the charity stripe (83.3%).

## 2011-12 SEASON NOTES

**YOUTH MOVEMENT** The average age of the three players the Hornets received from the Clippers in the December 14<sup>th</sup> trade (Al-Farouq Aminu, Eric Gordon and Chris Kaman) was 24 years old.

- Aminu (21) was the fourth-youngest player in the entire NBA last season.
- The Hornets have three rookies on the roster and four more players who had less than 82 games of NBA experience entering the season...in fact, the Hornets ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> in the NBA in least average experience with only 3.2 seasons of service per player coming into the year.
- New Orleans currently has just four players on the squad with more than four full years of NBA experience (Trevor Ariza, Jarrett Jack, Chris Kaman, Emeka Okafor).

**FLASH GORDON** Acquiring Eric Gordon in the trade for Chris Paul solidified the Hornets with one of the NBA's best shooting guards and the most prolific shooting guard to wear a Hornets uniform since Glen Rice. The 22-year old has made quite the impression on the league entering his fourth season, below are some bullet points on "The Commissioner".

- Quickly made a good impression on his new team by hitting the game-winning jumper with 4.2 seconds left to seal a one point victory for the Hornets in Phoenix 12/26.
- Became the first Hornet to score 20 points in his debut since the team moved to New Orleans in 2002.
- Gordon let the team in scoring (20) and assists (3) in his debut and made 9 of 12 two point field goals in a team-high 39 minutes.
- Finished last season as the NBA's 13<sup>th</sup> highest scorer, the second-youngest in that group (Blake Griffin was eight months younger).
- Led the Clippers last season in scoring 30 times, assists 15 times, steals 18 times and minutes 25 times.
- Finished last season ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in minutes per game.
- Averaged career highs in points (22.3), rebounds (2.9), assists (4.4), steals (1.27) and minutes (37.7) in 2010-11.
- Connected on an average of 119 three pointers a season in his first three NBA seasons.

**GETTING TO KNOW KAMAN:** Chris Kaman spent eight seasons with the Clippers, the second-most tenure in franchise history...below are some of his career highlights.

- Led the Clippers in scoring (18.5) and rebounds (9.3) in 2009-10.
- Named to first NBA All-Star team in 2009-10, tallied four points and three rebounds in 11 minutes.
- Named Western Conference Player of the Week twice during the 2009-10 season (1/10/10 and 11/9/09).
- Participated in the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing as a member of the German National Team due to his great-grandparents heritage.
- Averaged a team-high 12.7 rebounds per game and 2.77 blocks per game (3<sup>rd</sup> in NBA) during a breakout 2007-08 season.
- Ranked 9<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in rebounds (9.6) during the 2005-06 season.
- Participated in the NBA All-Rookie game in 2004.
- Named Mid-American Conference Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year his final season (junior) at Central Michigan.

**GETTING TO KNOW THE CHIEF:** Al-Farouq Aminu, or "Chief" as some people like to call him since his first name means "the chief has arrived" in Nigerian, is a 21-year old small forward with much promise...below are some career highlights from the fourth-youngest player in the NBA last year.

- 8<sup>th</sup> overall pick by the Clippers in the 2010 NBA Draft out of Wake Forest, the highest draft pick out of Wake since Chris Paul (4<sup>th</sup>, 2006)
- Honorable mention AP All-American and Second Team All-ACC his final season (sophomore) at Wake
- Led Demon Deacons in scoring, rebounding and blocks his sophomore year
- First Wake player since Tim Duncan (1997) to lead the ACC in rebounding his sophomore season
- Freshman All-American by the Sporting News and ACC All-Freshman team member
- Older brother, Alade was a 2010 D-League All Star and played briefly for the Miami HEAT last season.
- 2008 McDonald's All American and played in the Jordan Brand Classic.

- Named Second Team All-Rookie and finished fifth in NBA Rookie of the Year voting for 2008-09 season.
- Earned Second Team All-America honors from the NABC and Third Team honors from the AP in his lone season at Indiana University
- Named Big Ten Freshman of the Year and First Team All-Conference
- Set Indiana and Big Ten freshman record for total points scored (669), breaking the old mark held by Michael Redd in 1998.

**BEE-FENSE** So far in 2011-12, the Hornets are again showcasing the stellar defense displayed a year ago, the first under head coach Monty Williams.

- The Hornets have **held seven of their first eight opponents under 100 points this season and rank 9<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in opponent points allowed per game (92.3)**...the Bees also rank **12<sup>th</sup> in opponent field goal percentage at (43.3%) and 10<sup>th</sup> in opponent three-point field goal percentage (30.8%)**.
- Against one of the most prolific scorers in league history, the Hornets held Mavericks F Dirk Nowitzki to 2-11 shooting from the field in 30 minutes 1/7 at DAL.
- New Orleans has only allowed an opponent to score over 30 points in a quarter three times so far this season (32 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> at UTA 1/2 and 34 in the 4<sup>th</sup> vs. PHI 1/4 and 34 in the 4<sup>th</sup> vs. DEN 1/6) and did not allow and 30 point quarters through the first four games.
- Against Boston 12/28, the Hornets held the Celtics to 37.2% shooting (29-78) from the field, the second opponent in two games that they held under 40%...Boston was held under 80 points (78) for the game...**the Bees held nine opponents under 80 points in 2010-11 and were 9-0 in those games**...New Orleans held their first two opponents under 90 points, **something the team did 28 times last year, yielding a record of 25-3**... Hornets players blocked 12 Celtic shots, more than in any game from a season ago (most in 2010-11 was 11 at CHI 3/7/11), and only three off the franchise record of 15 set 12/12/92 vs. DEN.
- In Phoenix 12/26, the Suns were held under 40% shooting (32-81, 39.5%) as well as 5-25 (20%) from distance...the Hornets ranked 13<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> respectively in the two opponent shooting percentage categories a season ago...the Hornets forced 15 turnovers including nine steals, leading to 15 points...those numbers were right in line with the 14.54 opponent turnovers per game and 16.37 points off of those miscues that New Orleans averaged last season...the Suns were held to 84 points after scoring over 100 in each of the four meetings between the two clubs in 2010-11.

**CLEANING THE GLASS** New Orleans ranks **4<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in rebounds per game (45.8), 6<sup>th</sup> offensive rebounds per game (12.9) and is 5<sup>th</sup> in defensive rebounds per game (32.9)**...New Orleans also **rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in total and defensive rebound percentage and 3<sup>rd</sup> in offensive rebound percentage in the NBA**.

- The Hornets have only lost the rebounding battle one time this season (by one 36-37 1/6 vs. DEN) and are +58 on the glass this season including +22 on the offensive end.
- Twin towers Emeka Okafor and Chris Kaman lead the team at 8.0 and 7.9 rebounds per game, respectively, while Carl Landry is grabbing an impressive **3.3 offensive boards per outing**.
- 1/1 at SAC, Chris Kaman came off the bench and grabbed 15 rebounds in just 27 minutes of play....Kaman grabbed 12 boards (all defensive) in his first Hornet start 1/6 vs. PHI.

**ROOK-IE NO MORE** Al-Farouq 'Rook' Aminu had a breakout game in his sophomore season 1/7 at DAL

- **Aminu set career highs with 12 rebounds (all defensive, also a career high) and four steals and scored a season high 15 points to lead the team in scoring...it was Aminu's first double-double of his career**...Aminu's previous high rebounds was eight (four times) and his previous high in steals was three (three times)...The 21-year old also went 2-4 from distance in addition to 5-6 from the line.

**JACK ATTACK** Jarrett Jack has been on a tear this season, averaging 16.1 ppg as well as leading the team with 7.7 assists per contest, good for **8<sup>th</sup> best in the league**, to go along with 4.1 rebounds and 0.7 blocks.

- Jack and LeBron James are the **only players in the league this season to be averaging over 16 points, seven assists and four rebounds per game this season**.
- 1/2 at UTA, Jack's stat line was 27 points, 11 assists, five rebounds and two blocks, making him **only the second Hornets player in franchise history to reach those totals in a game** (the other was Baron Davis 3/1/04 at WAS).
- 1/4 vs. PHI, Jack posted his second double-double in as many games, netting 19 points and dishing 11 assists with five rebounds.
- Jack has lead the team in assists five times this season and in scoring twice.

**FIRSTS BUT NOT LASTS** Playing shorthanded 1/7 at DAL with only 10 players available, Carldele Johnson and Gustavo Ayón seized the opportunity to earn more time in the first extended minutes of their NBA careers.

- Johnson played 17 minutes for the Bees, hitting on 3-4 three-pointers en route to nine points with two assists.
- Ayón played seven minutes, grabbing two rebounds and hitting on his only shot from the field, while drawing the assignment of Dirk Nowitzki on the defensive end...Ayón contributed to holding Dirk to 2-11 shooting for the game.

**GOOD GUARDS** Against the Nuggets 1/6, New Orleans guard rotation of Jarrett Jack, Marco Belinelli and Greivis Vasquez combined to score 44 points, dish 14 assists, grab 10 rebounds and create five steals.

- The trio shot 17-37 (45.9%) from the field, including 8-17 (47.1%) from beyond the arc.
- Greivis Vasquez had a career night, setting **personal marks for three-pointers made (four) and attempted (seven) en route to a team-high 16 points, just one shy of his career high.**

**BEES DO IT FROM DEEP** The Hornets found their shooting stroke from distance against the Nuggets 1/6 at the Hive, setting the team's early-season mark for most three's made in a game (eight, previously four vs. BOS 12/28) and shooting 47.1% (8-17) as a team from distance...Greivis Vasquez's four triples were a career high.

**FINE FROM THE LINE** Though the team is shooting just 76.3% from the free throw line, New Orleans boasts some of the best individual shooters in this young season...Jarrett Jack (20-21) currently ranks 8<sup>th</sup> in the league at 95.2%...Chris Kaman is perfect from the line (10-10) on the year...Al-Farouq Aminu (14-16, 87.5%) and Carl Landry (34-40, 85.0%) also rank in the top 50 in the league this season.

**BALANCE, BALANCE, BALANCE** So far this year, **10 different Hornets have reached the double-digit plateau.**

- At DAL 1/7, six different Hornets players scored 8+ points, led by Al-Farouq Aminu's 15...Carledele Johnson hit on three three-pointers, including his first career field goal en route to nine points.
- The 2011-12 season began 12/26 at PHX with a balanced offensive attack that included six players reaching double figures: Eric Gordon (20), Carl Landry (14), Trevor Ariza (13) and Marco Belinelli, Chris Kaman and Greivis Vasquez all with 10 points each...
- As a follow-up to the season opening performance, five Hornets reached the 10-point mark in the home season opener 12/28 vs. BOS led by Jarrett Jack's 21 and Carl Landry's 20...the others were Belinelli and Emeka Okafor (13) and Chris Kaman (12).

**STARTING LINEUPS** Through eight games this season, the Hornets have used four different starting lineups and have not yet been able to roll out the preferred preseason starting five (Jack-Gordon-Ariza-Landry-Okafor) for a single game this season.

**COMPACT CAMPAIGN** The shortened 2011-12 season will feature 66 games over the course of only 120 days (not including the three day All-Star Break). Here are some notes that the peculiar schedule has produced:

- January will be the toughest month in terms of games played for the Hornets, with 18 contests (including 10 home dates), an average of a game every 1.72 days! This marks the **fourth time in franchise history the Bees have had 18 games in a single month**, joining March and April 1999 (also a post-work stoppage season) and in March of 1990...the last time the Hornets had 10 home games in a month was in January 2007, when they played host to 11 games.
- The Hornets will play a back-to-back-to-back February 20<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup> in Oklahoma City, Indiana and Cleveland, respectively, only the second time in franchise history the team has had such a stretch of games.
- The '11-'12 schedule features 15 sets of back-to-back games, with the first coming January 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in Sacramento and Utah...there will be three sets of home back-to-backs, all in the first three weeks of March (2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>/15<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>/22<sup>nd</sup>).
- Not until February 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> will the team have two consecutive days off without a game.

**BENCH MOB** New Orleans has had some great individual bench performances this season:

- Greivis Vasquez scored 16 points on 4-7 shooting from beyond the arc with four assists and four rebounds in 26 minutes 1/6 vs. DEN...in the same game, Carl Landry came off the bench for the first time this season to pour in 15 points and six rebounds.
- Chris Kaman has scored in double-figures off the bench in five of his six games on the second unit so far this season and is averaging 10.0 points and 8.1 rebounds in just 25 minutes per game while starting one contest
- In Utah 1/2 Three players on the second unit scored in double-figures: Jason Smith (16), Chris Kaman (14) and Al-Farouq Aminu (11)...it was the first time since 3/4/11 that the Hornets had three players score in double-figures off the bench when Jarrett Jack (19), Willie Green (15) and Carl Landry (14) broke the 10 point mark...the trio combined to shoot 17-26 (.654) from the field...Aminu's 11 points was his New Orleans high, including 5-6 free throws.
- Against Utah, Smith also grabbed a team-leading eight rebounds, while Kaman collected six himself.

**SABOR INTERNACIONAL = INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR** Two of the newest members of the Hornets roster, Gustavo Ayon and Greivis Vasquez, from Mexico and Venezuela respectively, are each the third player in NBA history from their home country.

- Ayón joins Haracio Llamas (Phoenix Suns, 1996-98) and Eduardo Najera (currently with the Charlotte Bobcats) as the only Mexican born players.
- Vasquez, a rookie last season, joined Carl Herrera (1991-96) and Oscar Torres (2001-03) as the only Venezuelan-born players.
- Marco Belinelli (Italy) is the only other foreign-born player on the Hornets roster, the sixth player born on the Apennine Peninsula to make the NBA.
- Chris Kaman, though American, holds dual U.S.-German citizenship and participated with the German national team this past summer in the European Championships.
- Recently acquired Xavier Henry was born in Belgium, and is one of only two players in the NBA (joining Tony Parker) to be born in that country.

**OKAFOR DOUBLES-UP** Emeka Okafor notched consecutive double-doubles with a season-high 16 rebounds and 10 points 12/30 vs. PHX and 12 rebounds and 13 points 1/1 at SAC.

- Okafor is now averaging close to a double-double for the season (8.4 points and 8.6 rebounds) and also **currently ranks 7<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in blocks per game at 2.14.**
- The season-high 16 rebounds was a mark he hit two times all of last season (high – 17 vs. IND 4/3/11), included eight offensive boards, something he did twice last year (12 vs. TOR 1/17/11 and 8 at LAL 3/27/11).
- Last season, Okafor had 23 double-doubles in 72 games and grabbed 10+ rebounds 35 times in all...he also had four 15/15 games and two 20 point/10 rebound performances.

**GORDON IN THE GAME** In the two games Eric Gordon has played for New Orleans this season, he is averaging a team-best 21.0 points as well as 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.5 blocks.

- Gordon has led the team in scoring both times he has played this year.
- In his home debut, 'The Commissioner' hit his first four shots from the field en route to an 11 point first quarter and ended the game with 22 points.
- His Hornets debut was a memorable one, hitting the game-winning jumper with 4.2 seconds to play 12/26 at Phoenix...in the game, Gordon also became the first player to score at least 20 points in his team debut since the team moved to New Orleans in 2002.

**OH, SHOOT** Missing key offensive cog Eric Gordon to a bruised knee, the Hornets struggled shooting the ball 12/30 vs. PHX and 1/1 at SAC.

- Against the Suns, New Orleans was held to 26-90 shooting from the field (**28.9%**), **the lowest percentage in franchise history**...the 64 missed field goals did allow the Hornets to collect an NBA season-high 24 offensive caroms.
- Marco Belinelli set a career high with 10 rebounds against the Suns (previous high was nine at CHI 3/7/11)...Belinelli also tied his career mark (vs. HOU 12/12/08) with three offensive rebounds in the game.
- In Sacramento, the Bees went 0-15 from beyond the arc, their **worst shooting performance from long-range in franchise history**...the previous franchise low for threes attempted without a make was 13 vs. DEN 11/16/05...the last time the Hornets had not made a here in a game before the 1<sup>st</sup> was against Chicago 3/14/09.

**LANDRY IN THE LINEUP** Carl Landry has made the most of being named the starting power forward in this, his fourth NBA season, starting all but two games so far this year.

- Landry currently leads the Hornets in total points (114), offensive rebounds (26) and free throws made (34) and throws attempted (40).
- 1/4 vs. PHI, Landry scored 21 points and pulled down eight rebounds, including four offensive.
- 12/28 vs. BOS, Landry scored 20 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in 29:16 of play, becoming just the third Hornet since the team moved to New Orleans in 2002 to record a 20/10 game in fewer than 30 minutes...the late Robert Traylor (20/10 in 22 minutes vs. ATL '03) and Jamaal Magloire (23/14 in 29 minutes at WAS '04) are the others.
- As a starter last season (26 games between SAC and NOH), he averaged 14.3 points, 5.9 rebounds (2.8 off. rpg) and 31.5 minutes per game.
- **Prior to this season, Landry had made 54 career starts – averaging 16.2 points and 6.2 rebounds in 34.3 minutes per game...in starts, he has hit on 346-of-685 (.505) from the field.**
- After taking over the starting slot for the injured David West (10 games) last season, Landry is averaged a team-best 14.9 points with 5.6 rebounds on 51.8% shooting in 32.7 minutes per game.
- In 28 starts for SAC in 2009-10, Landry averaged 18.0 points and 6.5 rebounds per game, hitting on 52.0% from the field.
- **In 2009-10, Landry averaged 5.6 points in the fourth quarter- ranking him 10<sup>th</sup> in the NBA.**

**CAPTAIN JACK & Co.** Monty Williams named Jarrett Jack, Eric Gordon and Emeka Okafor captains for the 2011-12 season...Okafor, whose eight years of experience ties him for most on the roster, is the longest tenured Hornets player, entering his third season with the club...Jack enters his 7<sup>th</sup> season in the league and his first full season with the Hornets after being acquired mid-season last year...Gordon is in his fourth year in the league and first with the Hornets after headlining the offseason deal with the Los Angeles Clippers and wasted no time introducing himself to fans and teammates alike by hitting the game-winning shot with 4.2 seconds remaining in his debut 12/26 at Phoenix.

**NEW FACES** There were nine players on the opening day roster who were not members of the team in 2010-11. In the season opener, five players made their debut wearing the creole blue, and in the first home game on 12/28 vs. BOS, two more Hornets were newly-minted.

- Al-Farouq Aminu, Eric Gordon, Carldeell Johnson, Chris Kaman and Greivis Vasquez all appeared in their first game as Hornets 12/26 at PHX.
- For 'Squeaky' Johnson, a New Orleans native, the game also marked his NBA debut...Johnson made his debut at the Hive two days later on 12/28 vs. BOS, connecting on a technical free throw to an ovation from his hometown crowd.
- With two minutes played 12/28 vs. BOS, Trey Johnson also officially joined the Hornets all-time roster, playing in his 13<sup>th</sup> career game in the NBA with his fourth team over three seasons.
- On January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012, with 2:03 to play in the game, Gustavo Ayon stepped foot on the court, officially becoming the third Mexican born NBA player in league history.

**SOLD OUT** 17,802 New Orleans fans packed the Hive on opening night 12/28 against the Celtics, a sellout crowd that witnessed a 19-point drubbing of the Eastern Conference foes...the Hornets had nine sellouts in 2010-11, with a high of 18,437 in addition to selling out all three home playoff games.

**10,000 SEASON TICKETS** The New Orleans Hornets sold more than 10,000 season tickets for the 2011-12 season, including selling the most new season tickets in the NBA since June...this strong demonstration of community commitment to the long-term presence of the NBA team in New Orleans is all the more remarkable because it was achieved in the midst of significant uncertainty regarding team ownership and a labor work stoppage...the Hornets pursuit of 10,000 season tickets was initiated in February as the team began its infamous "I'm In" campaign, which included appearances and public support from Governor Jindal and Mayor Landrieu...the campaign included grassroots marketing, electronic billboards, radio and TV advertising and, most importantly, the unprecedented "100 Events in 100 Days: I'm In, Are You?" initiative.

**SAINTS/HORNETS CONNECTION** When Eric Gordon heard he was coming to New Orleans, he knew he had a couple of Super Bowl Champion friends that could share some tips on life in the Big Easy...Gordon went to the same high school and college as Courtney Roby of the Saints and attended Indiana University with Tracey Porter.

**EVERY HORNETS GAME IS ON TV!** For the first time in franchise history, Hornets fans will have an opportunity to watch every single game this season. CST will broadcast 65 regular season games, while TNT will broadcast the lone non-CST game (4/24 at GSW).

**NATIVE SON** Hornets rookie point guard Carldeell 'Squeaky' Johnson hails from New Orleans...in his rookie season, Johnson is now the seventh active NBA player to be born in the state of Louisiana joining D.J. Augustin (Bobcats), Paul Millsap (Jazz), Brandon Bass (Celtics), Tyrus Thomas (Bobcats), Greg Monroe (Pistons) and Thaddeus Young (76ers).

- New Orleans' defense improved more than any team last season, down a league-leading 8.1 ppg.
- With the 3/6/11 win at CLE, the Hornets registered their 37th win of the season – tying their win total for the 2009-10 season (37-45).
- The Hornets ranked first in the NBA in points given up off turnovers (14.56).
- The Hornets won their **900th** game as a franchise 2/11/11 at ORL.
- The Hornets finished the season 46-36.
- The Hornets held opponents to 90 or fewer points 28 times (24-4).
- The Hornets were 25-6 when holding opponents under 100 points at home last season.
- Dating back to the 2006-07 season, the Hornets have won 19 of their last 26 overtime games.
- The Hornets played six overtime games last year...the Hornets were 4-2 in overtime games last year...New Orleans was 3-3 in OT games in '09-10.
- The Hornets had a home crowd of 18,426 2/5/11 vs. LAL – the largest regular season crowd at the Hive last season...**it was the highest attendance post-Hurricane Katrina.**

WE'RE IN! 2011 PLAYOFFS With a 101-93 win over Houston on 4/6, the Hornets clinched a berth in the 2011 playoffs.

- The victory clinched a postseason berth for the Hornets, the third time in four seasons and fifth time since moving to New Orleans that the franchise had participated in the playoffs.
- It marked the Hornets' 12<sup>th</sup> playoff appearance in franchise history.
- Monty Williams became the third first-year head coach to qualify for the playoffs in franchise history (Dave Cowens, 1996-97; Tim Floyd, 2003-04).

- The Hornets were FIFTH in the NBA for fewest points allowed (94.9 ppg)...the Hornets allowed 102.7 ppg last season.
- The Hornets forced 14.54 opponent turnovers per game and averaged 16.37 points off of those miscues.
- New Orleans limited opponents to 45.7 percent shooting, while averaging 45.9 percent from the field on the offensive end.
- The Hornets allowed opponents 10.49 second-chance points per game after allowing 13.3 second-chance points during the 2009-10 season...the Hornets ranked first in the NBA in fewest second-chance points allowed per game.
- The Hornets gave up 11.73 fastbreak points per game – the fourth fewest in the NBA.
- The Hornets ranked among the best in the league in a number of defensive categories including fewest points (4th – 94.9), defensive field goal percentage (13th - .457), defensive three-point field goal percentage (12th -.357), rebounds per game (3rd – 39.34) and offensive rebounds allowed (1st- 9.38).

# BUSY BEES

## A Look at the Hornets' Off-season



**MAKING CHANGES:** The Hornets have been one of the most active teams in this season's condensed free agency period. New Orleans goes into the 2011-12 campaign with only six returning players from the 2010-11 roster and nine new players, while Emeka Okafor (two years) is the longest-tenured Hornet and only remaining member of the roster inherited by Dell Demps and his staff when they took the helm in the summer of 2010. Below is a timeline of the Hornets' off-season:

June 23, 2011	Trade the rights to center Jonathan Harrelson (45 <sup>th</sup> overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft) to the New York Knicks for financial considerations.
June 27, 2011	David West declines player option for the 2011-12 season and becomes a free agent.
June 30, 2011	Extend qualifying offer to guard Marco Belinelli for the 2011-12 season.
July 7, 2011	Reigning NBA D-League champion Iowa Energy named new Hornets D-League affiliate.
August 2, 2011	Dave Hanners named assistant coach...Randy Ayers named lead assistant coach.
December 9, 2011	Hornets sign nine free agents (Brian Butch, Justin Dentmon, Jerome Dyson, Moses Ehambe, Carldele Johnson, Trey Johnson, DaJuan Summers, Trey Johnson and Terrico White) to training camp roster.
December 13, 2011	Marco Belinelli signs qualifying offer...waive forward Patrick Ewing Jr.
December 14, 2011	Acquire forward Al-Farouq Aminu, guard Eric Gordon, center Chris Kaman and the more favorable of the 2012 first round picks between the Los Angeles Clippers and Minnesota Timberwolves from the Clippers in exchange for guard Chris Paul and two 2015 2 <sup>nd</sup> round picks.

### Dell Demps ▪ Senior Vice President and General Manager

- On July 21, 2010, Dell Demps was named the seventh general manager in Hornets history. It is Demps' first stint as general manager of an NBA franchise.
- Demps joined the Spurs at the start of the 2005-06 season as director of pro player personnel and was promoted to Vice President of Basketball Operations in 2010. In addition to his duties with the Spurs, Demps was named general manager of the Toros when they were first purchased by the Spurs in June 2007.
- With the Spurs, Demps won an NBA Championship (2007) and two divisional titles (2006, 2009). In each of the last five seasons that he was with San Antonio, the Spurs won at least 50 games.
- Demps had the opportunity to play in the NBA for Golden State (1993-94), San Antonio (1995-96) and Orlando (1996-97), as well as playing professionally in the Philippines, France, Greece, Turkey, Croatia and Venezuela during his 10-year career.

- During his professional playing career, each summer he returned to Pacific to take MBA courses. When Demps suffered a season-ending shoulder injury in 1998, he returned to Pacific and completed his MBA.
- At Pacific, Demps was a four-year starter, earning All-Big West honors three times. After completing his MBA, Demps became a member of Pacific's Eberhardt School of Business Advisory Board. He was also elected to the Pacific Athletics Hall of Fame in 2003.
- Demps, a native of the San Francisco Bay Area and his wife, Anita, have three sons, Jourdan (21), Tre (18), and Riley (11). Jourdan attends the University of Texas-San Antonio and Tre is in his freshman year playing basketball at Northwestern University. Riley is great student-athlete that excels in football and basketball. Anita is a 1998 graduate of Pacific's McGeorge School of Law.
